After earning his BA from Harvard University in American Studies and a PhD in clinical and personality psychology from Duke University, Kenneth Shapiro taught in the Psychology Department at Bates College in Lewiston, Maine. Shapiro is cofounder and executive director of Animals and Society Institute; founder and editor of *Society and Animals: Journal of Human-Animal Studies*; cofounder and coeditor of *Journal of Applied Animal Welfare Science*; and founding editor of Brill Human-Animal Studies Book Series. He currently directs the ASI AniCare program, a psychological assessment and treatment approach for juveniles and adults who abuse animals.

He is the author of three books, most recently – *Animal Models of Human Psychology: Critique of Science, Ethics and Policy*. He lives with partner Ann and companion Tosca, rat-terrier/beagle mix. His interests include vegan cooking, jazz, and history.
