For Home and Community Based Services/Frail Elderly Waiver (HCBS/FE)



What is Targeted Case Management for Frail Elderly customers (TCM-FE)?

As a customer receiving Home and Community Based Services for the Frail Elderly (HCBS/FE) waiver you will also receive TCM-FE services. TCM-FE services are defined as those case management services that will assist you in gaining access to medical, social, and other needed services.

Freedom of Choice

As a customer receiving TCM-FE services you have the freedom of choice to receive these services from the qualified case management provider of your choice.

If you are dissatisfied with your service you may change TCM-FE providers at any time as long as there are additional TCM-FE providers available. You also have the option to remain with your current provider and request another case manager, when your dissatisfaction is specified to the case manager.

What will the service provide?

TCM-FE services allow four core components to be provided to you to assist you in gaining access to in-home services. These core components consist of:

- assessment,
- plan of care development,
- referral and related activities, and
- monitoring and follow-up activities.

Assessments are completed to determine your service needs. Plan of care development outlines those services needed in your home to address your medical, social and other service needs. Referral and related activities are those tasks that link you with other programs and services. Monitoring and follow-up activities are tasks and contacts to ensure your plan of care is implemented and adequately addresses your needs.

How is this service funded?

The service is funded as a Medicaid State Plan service using Medicaid federal funds and State match. There are no fees involved that you would be responsible for paying in order to receive TCM-FE services.
