- Federally Funded Initiative from AoA and CMS
 - Started in 2003 with 12 States
 - Today, ADRC Grantees Include all 50 States and 3 Territories
 - Single Entry Point
 - Goals:
 - Provide Consumers with Information and Access to Services
 - Bridge the Gap Between Aging and Disability

 - RTZ Associates is the vendor that developed our system
